He believes the most important element to be impeccable speech. However, he discovers that the bet is not an easy one, as personalities, romance and socially significant issues get in the way. Though difficult and frustrating for both at first, the lessons soon begin to work wonders and produce results that neither predicted. The play is a sharp satire about social class, human behaviour and relations between the sexes clothed most often in comedy and witty dialogue.
